

ART | MASTER OF FINE ARTS (GRAPHIC DESIGN)

The Art and Design program offers a Master of Fine Arts (MFA) degree consisting of a minimum of 60 hours of graduate work. You must complete the degree requirements within 8 years and maintain a 3.0 GPA throughout the MFA program.

Students must choose a studio area of concentration from the following: **drawing, painting, sculpture, design (graphic design, photography), printmaking, ceramics and intermedia.**

Online or low residency options are available in some areas and are subject to decisions by the major professor.

Graduate School Graduation Requirements

All Graduate degrees ¹ require:

- Maintain a C or higher in all coursework.
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. (Refer to program)
- A minimum of 30-75 hours of Graduate course work. (Refer to program)
- Comprehensive Examination or equivalent assessment is required. (Master of Liberal Studies requires a Comprehensive Examination **and** Concentration Exam)
- Degree completion within 8 years.
