ADVANCED EDUCATION | MASTER OF SCIENCE IN EDUCATION (ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES ENDORSEMENT)

The English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program has two options: students may apply as graduate non-degree students and earn the endorsement only (15 credit hours), or apply as degree seeking graduate students and earn the endorsement plus a Master's degree (plus 18 credit hours = 33 credit hours). Applicants for either pathway must complete the required graduate courses with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA. All courses are offered fully online, providing you with convenience and flexibility. Some courses are offered as "short" courses (8 weeks in the fall or spring or 4 weeks in the summer).
